







TALK

"What are you thankful for? Who or what makes you happy?"

SING

I am Thankful for Thanksgiving", sung to the tune of "Did you ever see a Lassie?":

"I am thankful for Thanksgiving, Thanksgiving, I am thankful for Thanksgiving, it comes every year. We eat with our family, aunts, uncles, and cousins, all kinds of good foods, maybe turkey with stuffin'. I am thankful for the good things, the good things, I am thankful for the good things I have through the year." The children learned to say "Thankful", "Eat", "Food", and "Turkey" in sign language, and used the signs during the song.

WRITE

The children made *Paper Bag Turkey Puppets*, by gluing pre-cut construction paper feathers, beak, and wattle to a paper bag, and coloring circle stickers for the eyes. Then each child was asked what they were thankful for, and we wrote each item on a feather.

PLAY

When the turkey puppets were finished, the children used them to do "The Turkey Pokey": "You put your turkey in, you put your turkey out, you put your turkey in and he wobbles all about. You do the Turkey Pokey and you turn yourself around. That's what it's all about!- Gobble Gobble Gobble!"

Take a walk with the children through the beautiful Fall! Bring a list of items (with pictures), a clipboard and pen, and a collecting bag. Ask the children to look for the items as they come into view. Customize the list with items from the park or neighborhood where you will be.

EASY - Crafts and a Snack



Trace a child's hand on brown paper & let them glue on feathers.



Let the children glue on tissue paper squares to color the tail feathers.



No-Bake Pumpkin Pie in a Cup
